Fees Increase

In order to attract and retain good, qualified nursery nurses, we have had to implement two pay rises since April. Even with doing this, it has been a huge struggle to attract staff. There are very few nursery nurses around these days, as several have left the sector for higher wages elsewhere. This is not something that just effects Toy Box. Every nursery throughout Doncaster and indeed up and down the country, is having the same problem.

It has been such a hard year for all our long term staff, but thankfully and fingers crossed, we are now over the hump. During severe staff shortage times, staff had to work lots of extra hours and give up their half day off. We now have a full compliment of fully qualified and experienced nursery nurses. We are completely fully staffed and ready to start the new term in September.

We have tried as far as possible to absorb lots of the costs incurred in the second pay rise. Unfortunately, with the best will in the world, we are unable to absorb all the costs involved. So, in order to retain our staff and continuously deploy two fully qualified and experienced nursery nurses in each room, we have no alternative but to increase the fees in September.

Therefore from the 1st. of September the fee structure will be as follows.

Current fees

Half day £34.50 Full day £54.50

From September 1st.

Half day £36.50 Full day £56.50

If any parent/carer would like to discuss the fees increase with me or require further clarification, please do not hesitate to either call me or speak to me at pick up time.

Missing clothes

We have recently had a number of items of clothing that have gone missing at nursery. Could I please ask all parent/carers to check if an item of clothing which your child brought home is not theirs. If you do find an item of clothing that does not belong to your child, please return it to nursery.

We totally understand that these things happen quite innocently. If you do find a piece of clothing, or indeed any other item that does not belong to your child, please return it to nursery.

Please make sure all items of clothing are clearly labelled. It certainly will make our life much easier.

Reminders Spare Clothes

Please, can parents/carers remember to bring a spare change of clothes to nursery on a daily basis.

Throughout the course of the day, as well as potty training, the children take part in several wet messy activities. To enable staff to keep the children dry and comfortable, each child needs to have their own spare set of clothing. We constantly use our own "spares" but unfortunately these "spares" are seldom returned to nursery, resulting in our stocks being completely depleted. So please, please, please do not forget to ensure your child/ children come to nursery every day with a sun hat, sun cream and a spare change of clothing.
